ENVISION SUPPLIER DIRECTORY

A searchable database where vendors can showcase their sustainable solutions to infrastructure project teams.

The Envision Supplier Directory will assist public agencies, design teams, contractors, and other infrastructure decision-makers in identifying materials, products, services, and technologies that can help solve specific sustainability challenges on projects.

Each listing in the directory includes the name of a sustainability-related material or service with a description, supporting documents, and contact information. Suppliers must also associate their offerings with specific credits in the Envision framework.

By tying their solutions to Envision in the directory, suppliers engage with a rating system that is increasingly well recognized across the infrastructure community. All listings in the directory are linked to specific credits within Envision, tying suppliers to the industry's leading sustainable infrastructure system.



Envision is a holistic consensus-based framework and rating system that guides and assesses the sustainability, resilience, and equity of all types of civil infrastructure.

It is a comprehensive tool that can assist private and public agencies and their consultants and contractors in delivering infrastructure that tackles climate change, addresses public health needs, supports environmental justice, creates jobs, and spurs economic development.

Strong growth is forecast for Envision usage with the increasing global focus on sustainability and resiliency in the built environment.

Suppliers, of course, have been essential contributors on all of these projects, providing solutions to address specific sustainability challenges, although ISI has not explicitly recognized those supplier contributions — until now, with the Envision Supplier Directory.

A DIRECTORY FOR... MATERIALS PROVIDERS

The sustainability requirements and expectations of the infrastructure sector are ever-changing. Whether it's to source more resilient materials or identify better options for services, owners, consultants, and contractors are keeping a watchful eye on the marketplace to deliver the best projects.

The Envision Supplier Directory recognizes that project teams are looking for materials that:

- · Are energy and/or water efficient
- Include recycled content
- Support a circular economy
- Reduce embodied carbon
- Are cost-effective
- Are certified by a third-party sustainability program
- Align with sustainable procurement policies and practices
- Reduce waste
- Are innovative
- Contribute to improved public health and safety outcomes



Adding a listing in the directory is straightforward — suppliers can create one right from their ISI dashboard.

Any company that offers a sustainabilityrelated service or material can apply to become a supplier in the directory, and here are some initial considerations:

- If you are the administrator at a member company, login to your account to view the complimentary listings available to you. You can now begin the process of creating a listing. You can also view the options to purchase additional listings.
- If you are the admin of an organization that has a complimentary membership with ISI (non-member), log in and view the options to upgrade your membership to take advantage of the supplier program. Different tiers of membership are available based on firm size.
- 3. If you do not have an account with ISI, you will need to create a free account. From there, view membership tier options in your dashboard and select one in order to become a supplier. There are some fantastic benefits to ISI membership to consider, but if you decide that membership is not for you, we understand. You still have the option of purchasing supplier listings, without becoming an ISI member.



Each supplier will be asked watch an introductory training video covering the technical aspects of creating a listing and introducing the Envision framework.

Matching Solutions to Envision Credits

For a product or service to be listed, it must be linked with at least one credit in Envision. The directory training referred to earlier includes a built-in reference for every Envision credit. There are 64 of them in all, each addressing a sustainability indicator pertinent to infrastructure. Credits are divided across 5 overarching credit categories:



Quality of Life: Protecting and growing strong communities



Leadership: Committing to sustainability, collaboration, and planning



Resource Allocation: Conserving materials, energy, and water



Natural World: Preserving the environment and natural systems



Climate and Resilience: Mitigating climate change and developing more resilient communities

Limitation

The Directory supports expanded Envision awareness and use throughout the infrastructure supply chain. A listing cannot guarantee outcomes that suggest Envision award levels or an Envision total score. COMPLETING A LISTING IS STRAIGHTFORWARD

Submitting a listing involves the following steps:

- **1. Company info** (prefilled based on your ISI profile, but editable)
 - Listing type Material / Service

2. Listing info

- Material name and type
- Service regions
- Certifications and Awards, Marketing and Technical Material (optional)

- 3. Description
 - Detailed description
 - Sustainability outcomes

4. Envision Related Items

Envision related credits

5. Details

- Header photo
- Public Point of Contact information and website
- 6. Confirmation




Upon submission, the listing goes through a review process. Approved listings are added to the public-facing Directory. Disapproved listings can be edited and resubmitted.


Every material supplier must also answer the following questions with each of their listings:

- 1. Do you have an environmental management system in place that is consistent with ISO 14001?
- 2. Do you have an Environmental Product Declaration (EPD) for your offering?
- 3. Does you company produce an annual corporate sustainability report consistent with the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) or equivalent?
- 4. Is your offering third-party certified, for example by the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC), Green Seal, Underwriters Laboratories (UL) ECOLOGO® Certification, National Biosolids Partnership (NBP), Concrete Sustainability Council (CSC), or other?

Pricing


Members of ISI who pay an annual membership fee receive complimentary listings based on their membership tier. For example, member companies with 50 employees or fewer who pay a yearly membership fee of \$500 receive one free listing in the Envision Supplier Directory. Additional listings may be purchased at a reduced member rate. The table below presents the membership tiers and the corresponding number of listings in the Envision Supplier Directory.

The opportunity to add listings to the Directory is available to firms that offer sustainability-related solutions or materials, but do not currently have a free ISI account. Firms can either purchase a membership to access corresponding listings, or remain a non-member and pay the Supplier Non-member listing price.
